## Introduction

- The agenda was reviewed and accepted.
- The notes from the April 27<sup>th</sup> meeting were previously reviewed, approved and uploaded to the website. The action items from the previous meeting were updated.

## Progress on Risk Management and Testing Activities for 2012

- The plans for the follow-up blood lead study are going well.
  - Details regarding the environmental samples (e.g. sample size, bottles, QA/QC, etc.) are being worked out.
  - The temporary office for the study team to work from has been arranged. The office will be set up during the week of August 27<sup>th</sup> by a small sub-set of the overall study team. The rest of the team, consisting of 10-12 people, will arrive the week of September 4<sup>th</sup> and will spend the first week recruiting participants to the study. The team intends to have the field work completed in 5 weeks.
  - An ethics review for the blood lead study and the associated environmental study has been completed.
  - The required x-ray license for the XRF unit that will be used to test for lead in paint in the homes that are part of the study has been obtained. The associated radiation safety training has been completed by Intrinsic staff.
  - Planned communications are also in place. Materials were circulated through the schools prior to the summer break. Newspaper ads will be placed. Once children have returned to school this fall, materials for the parents will be sent home with the students.
  - If obtaining enough samples becomes an issue, it could be dealt with jointly by the TAC and CAC.
  - Once the study begins, weekly updates will be provided by Goss Gilroy staff.

- The purpose for the next CAC meeting, tentatively scheduled for September 20<sup>th</sup>, is:
  - To provide an update from the blood lead study team. The update should be circulated to the TAC prior to providing it to the CAC (see action #12-05).
